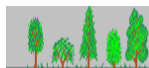

VENT PIPE MISSING VENT PIPE TOP AND FLASHING.

#1 SCREEN WINDOW MISSING AND OUTSIDE TRIM. APPROX. 10FT 4 ½ ID PIPE

#2 LEFT SIDING PULLED AWAY INTERIOR OK

#3 BACK SIDING PULLED AWAY SOME SHEETING MAYBE REQUIRED. 2 SEAT LIDS MISSING.

#4 LEFT SIDE INTERIOR WALL EATEN AWAY. VENT TOP MISSING
RIGHT DOOR REPAIR

FIRE PITS NEED CLEANING OUT. ALSO NOTED BOUNDARY RAILS MISSING THROUGHOUT CAMP GROUND
